Kathleen "Katy" Mae Bell Jones - age 89 and long time resident of the Hardin Valley community in Knoxville, TN - passed way Sunday, 29-Mar-2015 at Park West Hospital. She was preceded in death by: beloved husband of 48 years, W.K. Jones; sister, Marie Carrell of Alcoa; brother, Walter Bell; and parents, William and Loretta Bell. Surviving descendants include: three children, Ann Dodson (husband, Ross), Bill Jones (wife, Nancy), and Mark Jones (wife, Janet); and six grandchildren, Chris Jones, Mary Ann Dodson, Will Dodson, David Jones, Wesley Jones, and Maggie Jones. Katy was born in Parrottsville, TN on 1-Aug-1925. She graduated high school in 1943 while living at Eastern Star Villa in Adrian, Michigan. She helped her husband run the family farm in Hardin Valley - her residence for 64 years. She enjoyed sewing and often made clothes for herself and others. She was active at several area churches, including: Marietta Cumberland Presbyterian and Beaver Ridge United Methodist. In the early 1970s she helped in a successful community-wide grass-roots effort to stop an Oak Ridge airport development in Hardin Valley. In her later years she toured Alaska with her sister and saw London, England with family. In 2004, she visited Rome, Italy, with her good friend, Anne Sekula.
