Virginia Wright Young, 95, peacefully passed away on October 28, 2020 in Knoxville Tennessee. Born in Boston, Massachusetts on September 9, 1925, she spent her childhood years growing up in Hull, Massachusetts. She lived most of her adult life in Atlanta, Georgia, Port St. Lucie, Florida, and in Highlands, North Carolina, where she spent 30 years as members of Highlands Falls Country Club. Virginia worked at the Pentagon in Washington D.C. during WWII and later for the National Archives in Atlanta, Georgia, serving as Administrative Officer, for many years before her retirement.
